Re: Verification of Institutional Control Compliance at Nome New Power Plant

Dear Mr. Handeland:

The Contaminated Sites Program is conducting an audit of contaminated sites closed with conditions (Institutional Controls) to verify that closure stipulations such as periodic monitoring and reporting are being performed by the responsible party of record as required under state law (18 AAC 75.375).

In 2007 the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) granted a Record of Decision for the Nome New Power Plant site that included conditions requiring perimeter fencing be placed around the property and maintained to prevent unauthorized access, that signs be posted and maintained which notify the public of the restricted access requirements, and that a soil cap of 4 to 7 feet over the contaminated soil areas be maintained to prevent soil and water exposure pathways. However, we have not received any documentation of the fencing installation, the sign postage, or maintenance of the soil cap on the referenced property. The Record of Decision document detailing the institutional controls that are in effect for this property is enclosed.

Requested Documentation

In order to ensure that conditions at the site are protective of human health, welfare and the environment, DEC requests that you provide the following:

- Nature of the current land use of the Nome New Power Plant property.
- Current status of the soil cap of 4 to 7 feet over the contaminated soil.

- Photo verification of perimeter fencing placement and maintenance on the referenced property.
- Photo verification of sign postage notifying the public of restricted access requirements.
- If the fencing has not been installed and/or the signs have not been posted, please make arrangements to complete these requirements as soon as possible.

In addition to the fence installation, sign postage, and soil cap maintenance requirements, please be advised that the following Institutional Controls as established in the 2007 Record of Decision continue to apply:

- A deed notice precluding the installation of any groundwater wells without DEC review or approval shall be attached to the property.
- The owner/operator of the site shall ensure oversight and screening by a qualified environmental
 consultant when (or if) soil excavation is proposed. In the event that contamination is
 discovered, DEC shall be notified.
- The owner/operator shall ensure any exposure risks are incorporated into the facility's health and safety plan.
- Construction activities may require workers to wear appropriate personal protection equipment in accordance with the facility's site safety plan.

DEC is concerned that the site conditions may not be protective. Failure to maintain these requirements may result in re-opening of the site by the Contaminated Sites Program, in which case, further remediation could be mandatory.
