Dear Ms. Gunter:

The Contaminated Sites Program is conducting an audit of contaminated sites closed with conditions (Institutional Controls) to verify that closure stipulations such as periodic monitoring and reporting are being performed by the responsible party of record as required under state law (18 AAC 75.375).

In June 2014 the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation (ADEC) granted a Cleanup Complete Determination – Institutional Controls (Decision Document) for the Senco Alaska site that included conditions requesting that the Institutional Controls (ICs) Agreement Page be signed and returned to ADEC within 30 days of receipt of the letter. Based on our records, we have not received a signed copy of this document as requested. The Decision Document outlining the original request is enclosed.

Requested Documentation

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Please review, sign, and return the signed copy of <u>Attachment A: Cleanup Complete-ICs Agreement and Signature Page</u> to the ADEC. A blank copy of the signature page is enclosed with this letter. The signed copy can be mailed, faxed, or emailed to <u>DEC.ICUnit@alaska.gov</u>.

Please be advised that the following Institutional Controls as established in the 2014 Decision Document remain in effect:

 Any future change in land use may impact the exposure assumptions cited in the 2014 Decision Document. If land use and/or ownership changes, these management conditions may not be protective and ADEC may require additional remediation and revised conditions. Therefore, Senco Alaska Inc. shall report to ADEC every 5 years to document land use, or report as soon as Senco Alaska Inc. becomes aware of any change in land ownership and/or use, if earlier. The report can be sent to the local ADEC office or submitted electronically to DEC.ICUnit@alaska.gov. Please note: your five year review will be due in June 2019.

- 2. Installation of groundwater wells requires ADEC approval.
- 3. Sub-surface soil contamination remains beneath the Senco Alaska building and below the buried sewer line. When the soil becomes accessible, the soil must be evaluated and contamination addressed to the satisfaction of ADEC.
- 4. Any proposal to transport soil or groundwater off-site requires ADEC approval in accordance with 18 AAC 75.325. A "site" [as defined by 18 AAC 75.990 (115)] means an area that is contaminated, including areas contaminated by the migration of hazardous substances from a source area, regardless of property ownership. (See site figure attached in the Decision Document.) This is a standard condition.
- 5. Movement or use of contaminated material in a manner that results in a violation of 18 AAC 70 water quality standards is prohibited. This is a standard condition.

The ADEC is concerned that these site conditions remain protective. Failure to maintain these requirements may result in re-opening of the site by the Contaminated Sites Program, in which case, further remediation could be mandatory.
