Dear Ron:

On July 24, 1991, the Kenai District Office of the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation received the report titled, "Quality Assurance Project Plan, Alaska Roadbuilders Gravel Pit".

The above mentioned recommendations and assessment work plan has been reviewed for approval in accordance with hazardous substance cleanup plan review, 18 AAC 75.319., and is hereby approved with the following conditions:

1. The clean-up levels for this site are cleaned up to level A on the matrix score sheet in the Department's "Interim Guidance for Non-UST Contaminated Soil Cleanup Levels", dated July 17, 1991. The cleanup levels may be changed if further information is presented warranting a change.
2. Disposal of all decontamination waste and wastewater is by approved Departmental procedures.

Please be aware of the State of Alaska's OSHA regulations for the disposal of asbestos. Please contact Jeff Carpenter, OSHA in Anchorage at 553-1757. If you are not certain that the insulation on the boiler/heater is or is not asbestos and you are not sampling it to determine if it is asbestos then you will have to treat the insulation as if it were asbestos. Any work with the asbestos has to be conducted with personnel that are qualified to handle asbestos as per the OSHA regulations. There are State of Alaska OSHA and U.S. EPA regulations covering the disposal of the asbestos. The Soldotna landfill is an EPA approved disposal site for asbestos. 800-424-4372 ext.1757. Before any asbestos is removed, Armina needs to be contacted and sent the information that she requires. For disposal of asbestos in the Soldotna landfill the Kenai Peninsula Borough has to be notified. The KPB contact is Lanie Hughes at 262-9657. ADEC considers asbestos as a solid waste and the proper disposal is covered by the State of Alaska OSHA regulations and by EPA regulations.

Also I recommend that the glass tubes used for sampling the barrels not be broken and disposed in the barrel that was sampled if the contents in the barrel are to be used for heat recovery. This would cause the oil to be filtered prior to being recycled. Please submit information on how you are going to dispose the glass tubes in another method.
