LOCATION(S) IMPACTED: Fairbanks, North Pole, and immediate surrounding areas

TIME/DATE OF UPDATE: Wednesday, December 1, 2010, 12:00 PM

VALID TIME: Valid December 1 until Friday, December 3 at 2:00 PM.

TIME/DATE OF THE NEXT REPORT: Friday, December 3 at 2:00 PM.

ADVISORY: Air Quality in Fairbanks, North Pole and the immediate surrounding area has deteriorated due to elevated levels of fine particulate matter. Conditions were **unhealthy for sensitive groups** over the last 24 hours and are expected to persist at these levels for the next two days.

PUBLIC IMPACT:

This is an area forecast, and as such is a general forecast for the Fairbanks and North Pole area. Pollution levels will vary depending on precise location, local emission sources, and wind flow patterns. Note that the particulate matter readings are from the downtown areas of Fairbanks and North Pole and may not be representative in your area. If you are sensitive to respiratory problems and experience any effects please follow the instructions of your physician.

Residents can take proactive measures to improve air quality by voluntarily reducing wood and coal burning while this air quality advisory is in effect. Residents who need to burn wood should ensure it is seasoned and practice smart burning practices. CURRENT OPEN BURN RESTRICTIONS: The Fairbanks North Star Borough prohibits open burning in certain areas during the period from November 1 through the end of February. For information on open burning, please contact the Borough at 459-1325.

The Air Quality Index is currently **Unhealthy for Sensitive Groups**. People with respiratory or heart disease, the elderly and children should limit prolonged exertion. The primary pollutant for the current AQI is PM_{2.5} Particulate.

The National Weather Service forecast is expected to result in poor dispersion conditions. Therefore Air Quality is expected to be Unhealthy for Sensitive Groups, and may not meet federal health standards.

DEC advises anyone with respiratory illness or heart disease, the elderly, and children to limit prolonged exertion. All others are cautioned to avoid outdoor activities or physical exertion when conditions reach unhealthy levels, as defined below:

The following table is the Air Quality Index for Particle Pollution.

0-50	Good	None
51-100	Moderate	Unusually sensitive people should consider reducing prolonged or heavy exertion.
101-150	Unhealthy for Sensitive Groups	People with heart or lung disease, the elderly and children should reduce prolonged or heavy exertion.
151-200	Unhealthy	People with respiratory or heart disease, the elderly and children should avoid prolonged exertion; everyone else should limit prolonged exertion.
201-300	Very Unhealthy	People with respiratory or heart disease, the elderly and children should avoid any outdoor activity; everyone else should avoid prolonged exertion.
Over 300	Hazardous	Everyone should avoid any outdoor exertion; people with respiratory or heart disease, the elderly and children should remain indoors.
