

Report card criteria - How are you graded?

Your letter grade is given to you the same way kids get their letter grades from school. It is all based on either your performance percentage (A = 90%-100%, B = 80%-89%, C = 70%-79%, D = 60%-69% and F = < 60%) or a Pass – Fail (S = 100% & U = 50%).

Overall Letter Grade is calculated by a weighted average, with Certified Operator and Approval to Operate weighted at 10% each and the other four criteria at 20% each.

MCL's -

- Is based on the number of samples your system took this quarter. For example, if your system took 25 samples and in those samples you've exceeded 1 MCL, you are at 96%.

Monitoring Requirements -

- If there are 25 monitoring samples that can be done in a quarter and you took 20 samples and 20 reports were sent to ADEC on time, you are at 80%

Sanitary Survey - A sanitary survey is a pass-fail; you either have a sanitary survey done on time or you don't.

- S - Satisfactory, the sanitary survey was completed.
- U - Unsatisfactory, the sanitary survey was not completed.

Certified Operator - Certified Operator is a pass-fail.

- S - Satisfactory, the operator is certified.
- I - Incomplete; in progress.
- U - Unsatisfactory, the operator is not certified.

Approval to Operate- An Approval to Operate is also a pass-fail.

- S - Satisfactory, your system has an approval to operate.
- NG - No grade given.
- U - Unsatisfactory, your system does not have an approval to operate

Previous Violations -

- You are graded on how well you close and take care of old violations that are still open. The grade is based on the percentage of previous violations (previous to the current quarter) that have been closed out and your system has come back into compliance. If all violations have been taken care of, you will receive 100%, or an A.
