Class "C" Underground Storage Tank Operator Training Recommended In-house Training Certification Checklist



The purpose of this form is to document that employees designated as Class C operators have completed training required by Alaska Administrative Code (AAC) 18 AAC 78.360-78.380. Class C operators are responsible for the initial response to alarms or other indications of emergencies at a facility. Class C operators shall complete the following questions:

#5 NOTE: The emergency stop switch shuts off power to all the dispensers and fuel pumps. The emergency stop switch is different from the "Stop" or "All Stop" button on the point-of-sale (POS) console. The emergency stop switch is required by national fire codes. Contact a qualified petroleum storage system service contractor if you cannot locate the emergency stop switch.

All Class C operators shall complete a State of Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation approved Class C Operator training program before assuming responsibilities as a Class C operator. Owners shall maintain this form for a minimum of three (3) years and make it available to any person identified in 18 AAC 78.056 (a)(1) upon request. No passing score is necessary; however, completing on-site training and this form does meet the Class C operator training requirements outlined in AAC 18 AAC 78.365.
