SITUATION REPORT

INCIDENT NAME: Eielson Air Force Base A10 Jet Crash **SITREP#:** 2 and final

SPILL NUMBER: 04309905601 **LEDGER CODE:** Not requested.

TIME/DATE OF SPILL: The A10 jet was reported to have crashed at approximately 8:30 PM on February 25, 2004, shortly after it had taken off from Eielson Air Force Base near Fairbanks, AK. Eielson Air Force Base reported the crash to the Alaska State Troopers located in Fairbanks at 8:50 PM.

TIME/DATE OF SITUATION REPORT: 9:30 AM, April 9, 2004

TIME/DATE OF THE NEXT REPORT: This is the final report.

TYPE/AMOUNT OF PRODUCT SPILLED: The A10 jet was carrying an unknown amount, but no more than 1500 gallons of jet fuel, 10 pints of engine oil, and 6 gallons of hydraulic oil.

LOCATION: The A10 jet crashed in the Chena Flood Plain area in the Fairbanks North Star Borough.

CAUSE OF SPILL: The cause of the plane crash is still being investigated by the US Air Force (USAF).

POTENTIAL RESPONSIBLE PARTY (PRP): US Air Force

RESPONSE ACTION: The USAF collected nine (9) snow samples from the impact site. All snow sample results met the state's cleanup criteria. However, soil samples collected from the impact area exceeded state cleanup levels requiring excavation of contaminated soil.

The ADEC Field SOSC and two DNR representatives were on site monitoring the contaminated soil excavation on April 6. Field screening was performed throughout the excavation and seven (7) final confirmation samples were taken. The excavation of contaminated soil was completed April 7.

SOURCE CONTROL: None.

RESOURCES AFFECTED: Tundra.

FUTURE PLANS AND RECOMMENDATIONS: Contaminated soil is currently stockpiled in an approved containment cell. Final soil thermal remediation will be performed by OIT in Moose Creek. Final sample results are expected to meet the state cleanup requirements. However, if the samples do exceed the cleanup levels, the state will coordinate with the USAF to determine an appropriate action plan. The USAF will continue coordinating with DNR for site restoration guidance.

WEATHER: For 9 April 04 at Eielson AFB: Partly cloudy, currently 45 degrees Fahrenheit, highs expected to reach 55 degrees.
