

Deploy free-oil recovery strike teams upwind and up current of Blue Fox Bay. Use aerial surveillance to locate incoming slicks.	Deploy multiple free-oil recovery strike teams as required to maximize interception of oil before it impacts sensitive areas. Deploy anchors and boom with skiffs (class 6). Using Bear Island as a central anchor point, place protected-water boom across the mouth of Blue Fox Bay. If the primary strategy is not feasible due to weather or sea state, deploy the alternative strategies to protect the streams in Blue Fox Bay. Tend throughout the tide. <u>Boom Lengths:</u> a. 2300 ft. b. 700 ft. Alternatives c. 600 ft. 200 ft. tidal-seal d. 100 ft. tidal-seal e. 150 ft. f. 150 ft.
