

**M/V SELENDANG AYU INCIDENT
UNIFIED COMMAND MEMORANDUM**

September 29, 2005

Subject: Unified Command Stand Down

The period of Spring and Summer Operations has been completed. All field operations under the control of the Unified Command that were authorized in the Incident Action Plan for the operational period commencing July 22, 2005 have been concluded and demobilization of operational equipment and personnel has been accomplished.

The next period of active operations will commence on or about 15 May 2006. It will include surveys of the 26 shoreline segments that have not reached the treatment end points defined in the SCAT Manual for the 2005 Spring and Summer operations period. Additional operations may be required, depending on the results of those surveys. A separate Operations Plan will cover that period.

During the intervening time until the mobilization of the Spring 2006 surveys, certain operations outside the direct control of the Unified Command will continue. These include partial wreck removal work by Magone Marine and routine U.S Coast Guard operations in the Unalaska area. The Unified Command is requesting the assistance of Magone Marine and the Coast Guard to observe the condition of the wreck of the SELENDANG AYU during the interim period. Specifically, requests are being made to photograph and report apparent changes in the condition of the wreck to the Unified Command using the contact information attached to this memorandum.

The Unified Command also desires to make provision for the proper reporting and disposition of other potential developments during the interim period until the Spring Survey Operations begin. A list of contacts for related events is included as Attachment 1. to this memorandum.

The Unified Command will stand down effective 2000 hours on Friday, 30 September. It will convene again on or about 15 May 2006 or as may be otherwise agreed.

Attachment 1 to Unified Command Memorandum of September 29, 2005

Among potential developments that may require reporting are the following:

1. **Remains of Missing Crew Members:** If human remains are discovered, processing will be required to determine if they are related to the SELENDANG AYU. Discoveries should be reported following the procedures routinely in effect for such circumstances.

2. **Aircraft Parts from the H60 Coast Guard Helicopter:** The investigation of the crash has been completed. There is not a continuing requirement to return parts as evidence.

3. **Unexploded Ordnance:** Any unexploded ordnance should be left in place and reported to:

4. **Oil:** If apparently new or fresh oil is found floating on the water or on shorelines in the area, it should be reported as a new spill so that investigation can be made to determine the source. Procedures for normal reporting of new spills should be followed. They include notification to the following:

5. **Oiled or Deceased Wildlife:** Oiled wildlife should be reported following the normal procedures to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. In particular, sea otter, harbor seal, and sea lion carcasses (oiled or unoiled) should be left in place. These animals must be

handled in a special manner in accordance with the Marine Mammal Protection Act and Marine Mammal Stranding Program Guidelines. Reports should be made to :


