SITUATION REPORT

INCIDENT NAME: M/V *Cougar Ace*

SITREP #: 10 and Final

SPILL NUMBER: 06259920501

TIME/DATE OF INCIDENT: The M/V *Cougar Ace* had been adrift since approximately 11:00 PM on, July 23, 2006, when the crew attempted to adjust ballast and the vessel keeled over onto its port side. The U.S. Coast Guard (USCG) reported the vessel's status to ADEC at 8:00 AM on July 24, 2006. The tug *Emma Foss* took the M/V *Cougar Ace* in tow on July 31, 2006 at 11:00 PM.

TIME/DATE OF SITUATION REPORT: 1:15 PM September 1, 2006.

TIME/DATE OF THE NEXT REPORT: This is the final report

TYPE/AMOUNT OF PRODUCT SPILLED: A small sheen of what appeared to be lubricating oil was stopped from the vessel's bow thruster area on August 2, 2006. The vessel is carrying a reported 142,184 gallons of Intermediate Fuel Oil (IFO) 380 and 34,182 gallons of Marine Diesel Oil (MDO) as estimated by the PRP. Former estimates did not account for fuel remaining in tanks prior to bunkering. The vessel is reported to be carrying approximately 4,813 vehicles as cargo. An undetermined amount of lubricant and transmission fluids spilled from the vehicles onto the cargo decks while the vessel was heeled over.

LOCATION: The vessel location as of August 16, 2006 has been at Icicle Seafoods' mooring buoy located in Wide Bay, Unalaska Bay at 53° 57.2 N, and 166° .36.7 W.

CAUSE OF SPILL: The cause of the sheen from the bow thruster area has not been determined.

POTENTIAL RESPONSIBLE PARTY (PRP): Mitsui OSK Lines, Tokyo, Japan.

RESPONSE ACTIONS: On August 31, 2006 USCG Marine Safety Detachment Unalaska satisfactorily completed the final inspections of the M/V *Cougar Ace* and cleared the vessel to sail. The *Sea Victory* will tow the *Cougar Ace*, and the Tug *Gladiator* will assist as an escort vessel to Portland, Oregon. The transit is expected to take about 10 days. The USCG also approved a Safety Plan for a four person crew to be aboard the *Cougar Ace* while being towed to Portland. The four person crew will keep watch around the ship, check the towing arrangement and maintain the emergency generator during service.

The M/V *Cougar Ace* under tow by the Tug *Sea Victory* departed Wide Bay at 10:30 AM September 1, 2006.

SOURCE CONTROL: None at this time.

RESOURCES AFFECTED: Marine waters. No oiled wildlife has been observed.

FUTURE PLANS AND RECOMMENDATIONS: ADEC will continue to monitor the vessel's towing progress to Portland Oregon.
