INCIDENT NAME: TG Service Tanker Rollover SITREP #: 2 and Final

TIME/DATE OF INCIDENT: The incident was reported by the State Troopers to ADEC at 8:00 A.M. on August 18, 2008 as occurring just prior to 8:00 AM.

TIME/DATE OF SITUATION REPORT: 12:00 PM on August 19, 2008.

TIME/DATE OF THE NEXT REPORT: This is the final report

<u>TYPE/AMOUNT OF PRODUCT SPILLED</u>: Potential for 9,000 gallons of liquefied methane and 150 gallons of diesel fuel. Exact amounts are still being determined.

LOCATION: Near milepost 179 on the Parks Highway.

<u>CAUSE OF SPILL</u>: A tanker-truck carrying refrigerated methane rolled over and began venting due to increased pressure. Saddle tanks carrying diesel were also compromised and leaked diesel. The cause of the accident is unknown at this time and is under investigation.

POTENTIAL RESPONSIBLE PARTY (PRP): TG Services, Wasilla

RESPONSE ACTIONS: The Matanuska-Susitna Borough units, including Trapper Creek Ambulance, Talkeetna Rescue, and Central Mat-Su Haz-Mat, responded to the scene to provide assistance, set up a safety zone near the site, and provide air monitoring with the help of 103rd Civil Support (Hazmat) Team. An ADEC responder from Anchorage was on site until early this morning to provide oversight. The Parks Highway was closed for five miles on either side of the accident until early this morning when the roadway was cleared and traffic was allowed to resume. The Alaska Railroad, which has tracks near the accident site, held trains for a short period until air monitoring determined that the area was safe for transit allowing their trains to resume normal operations.

SOURCE CONTROL: The methane was vented from the tank to release pressure and then remaining product was transferred to another tanker which continued to Fairbanks.

RESOURCES AFFECTED: Land along the Parks Highway. No wildlife impact has been reported.

<u>FUTURE PLANS AND RECOMMENDATIONS</u>: A site characterization and clean-up plan for the diesel spill will be developed by the PRP and submitted to the ADEC for approval.

WEATHER: Mostly cloudy, highs in the mid 60s to lower 70s with light winds.
