**TIME/DATE OF THE NEXT REPORT**: When the weather warms allowing heavy equipment to operate safely.

TYPE/AMOUNT OF PRODUCT SPILLED: #2 Diesel, 4000 Gallons

**LOCATION**: Richardson Highway MP 205

**CAUSE OF SPILL**: Fuel trailer "pup" separated from the tanker truck, and overturned, coming to rest in the ditch. No injuries were reported.

POTENTIAL RESPONSIBLE PARTY (PRP): Big State Logistics

**RESPONSE ACTION**: Trimms Creek, Alaska Department of Transportation maintenance and operations staff (ADOT M&O) were the first responders on-scene, and used their heavy equipment and snow to construct containment berms around the release. Big State Logistics (BSL) mobilized their 32-foot response equipment trailer, six spill responders, a track loader from Fairbanks, and an empty tanker truck from Valdez for lightering product. Fuel released from the pup solidified into a gel due to the extremely cold temperatures, and was contained within the "V" shaped road ditch. Product recovery and cleanup efforts are temporarily halted until weather conditions warm to approximately -30° F. The spill zone was isolated and delineated with absorbent boom and straw bales; exclusion fence surrounded the area.

**SOURCE CONTROL**: Material released to the ditch is stable and immobile due the extreme temperature and "V" shaped ditch.

**RESOURCES AFFECTED**: Soil.

**FUTURE PLANS AND RECOMMENDATIONS**: After the temperature warms to a safer operating environment for equipment and personnel, BSL will remove the contaminated snow with an excavator and load the snow into semi-side dump trucks. Trucks will transport the material to Fairbanks, where it will be melted and the fuel recovered. Additional cleanup and monitoring will continue during the breakup.

**WEATHER**: -40° F, Calm.
