Objective(s)</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Highest Priority of this Response is to Ensure the Safety of Citizens and Response Personnel</li> <li>• Protect environmental, historical, and cultural sensitivities.</li> <li>• Remove all fuel, persistent oils, and HAZMAT from vessel as per established plan.</li> <li>• Identify subsistence areas in the trajectory of potential release and develop a sampling plan.</li> <li>• SCAT will be in standby to be activated if new oil is observed from the vessel or lightering operations.</li> <li>• Ensure transparent communication with media, stakeholders and interested parties.</li> <li>• Maintain optimal administrative management of the vessel recovery operation; modify the vessel recovery plan as necessary to facilitate the safe, successful recovery of the vessel</li> <li>• Properly handle and dispose of waste generated from the response.</li> <li>• Continue to assess vessel stability and stabilize as appropriate</li> </ul>		
<b>4. Operational Period Command Emphasis</b> (Safety Message, Priorities, Key Decisions/Directions) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Report all injuries, incidents and close calls to the UC through your supervisor.</li> <li>• Fatigue issues for workers are of specific concern as the response continues.</li> <li>• Workers in cold weather require extra awareness, and extra caution should be taken to prevent cold weather injuries.</li> <li>• Report any sightings of oiled or impacted wildlife to the UC through the NOAA SSC(John Whitney)</li> <li>• While in the intertidal zone be especially mindful of slips, trips, falls and other water hazards.</li> <li>• Workers should advise their supervisor if they need essential supplies, i.e. prescriptions or special needs.</li> <li>• Workers are requested to complete daily ICS form 214a and provide them to their supervisor. This is to assist in documentation and to ensure work is properly compensated.</li> <li>• All media/press releases shall be routed through the UC for approval prior to release.</li> </ul>
