SITUATION REPORT

INCIDENT NAME: Adak Petroleum Diesel Spill **SITREP #**: 6

SPILL NUMBER: 10259901101

<u>TIME/DATE OF SPILL</u>: Adak Petroleum staff discovered fuel in the Adak small boat harbor at approximately 3:50 PM on January 11, 2010. Adak Petroleum reported the spill to ADEC at 6:27 PM on January 11, 2010.

TIME/DATE OF SITUATION REPORT: 2:00 PM on January 20, 2010

TIME/DATE OF THE NEXT REPORT: As the situation warrants

<u>TYPE/AMOUNT OF PRODUCT SPILLED</u>: The product spilled is #2 diesel fuel. Adak Petroleum estimates that up to 3,400 barrels (142,800 gallons) of fuel were released from a 114,000-barrel (4.8 million gallons) capacity storage tank as it was being filled from the tank ship *Al Amerat*. Based on January 11 visual observations, Adak Petroleum estimates that 1,000 gallons of fuel entered the small boat harbor.

LOCATION: Adak Petroleum bulk fuel facility, Adak Island, Aleutian Islands. Adak is approximately 1,200 miles southwest of Anchorage. Adak is in the Hawaii-Aleutian time zone, one hour earlier than Anchorage.

CAUSE OF SPILL: The spill occurred as fuel was being pumped to underground storage tank N-7 in the Helmet Creek Tank Farm from the *Al Amerat*, moored at the fuel pier in Sweeper Cove. Fuel escaped from tank N-7 into a drainage system that collects water from around the underground tanks and discharges it to Helmet Creek. The quantity of fuel overwhelmed the system's oil/water separator, resulting in a fuel release to Helmet Creek and the small boat harbor at its terminus. The spill appears to have been caused by tank N-7 being overfilled, but the exact route of the fuel from the tank to the drainage system is still under investigation.

POTENTIAL RESPONSIBLE PARTY (PRP): Aleut Enterprise, LLC (of which Adak Petroleum, LLC is a subsidiary)

<u>RESPONSE ACTION</u>: Response and recovery efforts on Helmet Creek and the Adak Small Boat Harbor continue and are nearing completion. Response crews expect to complete final collection of heavy oil contamination in Helmet Creek. A small section of hard boom lined with sorbent materials will be maintained and monitored at the outfall of Helmet Creek. Barrier boom and filter systems, which were placed on the creek for recovery purposes and to prevent oil from entering the small boat harbor, will remain in place to catch any residual oil and will be monitored by qualified personnel until ADEC deems that monitoring is no longer necessary.

Decontamination of response equipment and two vessels that remained inside the small boat harbor began January 19 and is expected to be completed today before containment boom is removed from the area. Recovered product is being stored in tank N-1 in the Helmet Creek Tank Farm. The total amount of oil recovered thus far has not been determined.

Demobilization of eleven response personnel will begin Thursday, January 21, and seven other responders will demobilize on Sunday, January 24, 2010. Responders remaining on-site will continue long-term monitoring.

The Unified Command will stand down today, January 20, 2010. ADEC oversight for the incident will continue as long as deemed necessary.

The Unified Command approved the Waste Management Plan, Decontamination Plan and the Demobilization Plan submitted by Alaska Chadux Corporation, a response contractor to the RP. A monitoring plan and a separate waste and liquids management and disposal plan is being developed by Polaris, a response contractor retained by the responsible party, and will be submitted to the Unified Command for approval.

Investigation into the cause of the fuel release from tank N-7 is under investigation.

<u>SOURCE CONTROL</u>: The flow of spilled fuel into Helmet Creek was stopped, and the fluid level in tank N-7 stabilized. Responders continue to monitor for any additional release.

<u>RESOURCES AFFECTED</u>: Helmet Creek and marine waters of Sweeper Cove. Shoreline in the small boat harbor has been oiled. The former Adak Army and Naval Operations Base is a National Historic Landmark. Helmet Creek and Happy Valley Creek are listed as anadromous streams in the Alaska Department of Fish and Game's stream inventory.

WILDLIFE: Bird sightings were reported in the area of the spill. Wildlife hazing will be implemented if necessary.

<u>COMMUNITY</u>: The Unified Command held a community meeting on Thursday, January 14, 2010 to address questions and concerns that residents had regarding impacts of the spill and ongoing response efforts.

FUTURE PLANS AND RECOMMENDATIONS: Continue free oil recovery from Helmet Creek; recover any remaining diesel fuel from the N-7 vault; continue with all necessary cleanup activities; conduct decontamination of equipment; and develop plans for continued monitoring and for waste and liquids management and disposal. A neutral third-party contractor will be brought in for determination of the total amount of fuel released to the environment and to quantify the volume of recovered diesel fuel during the response.

WEATHER: Today: mostly cloudy with snow showers, highs in the lower 30s, SW wind 5- to 15 mph. Thursday: partly cloudy to mostly cloudy, highs in the mid 30s, S wind 15 to 30 mph. Friday thru Sunday: mostly cloudy with a chance of rain and snow, highs 30s to 40s, variable winds.
