David,

I spoke with Herbert Graver today once again. He itemized the debris and hazardous materials. It includes: 3 5-gallon cans of paint in plastic jugs with potential to roll into the creek, 4 rusted cans of paint that are potentially leaking and could roll into the creek, fiberglass insulation coming off the bottom of the building and **getting into** Hoadley Creek and some ready to get into the creek. There is also metal and plastic that may be a result of debris from the main road crossing there.

I then spoke with Steven Schweppe, the City Attorney ((907) 228-5611), regarding ordinances that pertain to trash and litter in the City of Ketchikan. **Ordinance 9.68.060 Litter in lakes and fountains** specifies that, "No person shall throw or deposit litter in any lake, stream, bay or any other body of fresh or salt water within the municipality." There are a few other ordinances that speak of litter on private property as well. I called the city police department and asked that dispatch send an officer to the new Polar Treats to speak with the manager about getting it taken care of...without issuing a citation (max fine of up to \$300). Dispatch said they would get back to me and let me know what the results were.

Lynn,

Just to let you know, I gave Herbert Graver a call (225-3510) who contacted David Rodgers with a complaint regarding debris in a salmon stream in Ketchikan. According to Herbert, a closed restaurant (former location of Polar Treats), who's building overhangs the creek, is deteriorating and spreading "fiberglass and insulation" into the creek. In addition, numerous paint cans were observed and were tipped over. It was unknown to him whether or not they were leaking.

The restaurant, once called Polar Treats, has moved locations leaving this building on the creek vacant. I put a call into Bob Fultz with SPAR in Ketchikan. He followed-up with a site visit at 10:45 AM this morning. Bob reported 5-gallon buckets of sand and some that were closed. He noticed insulation coming off the building, but none of it was getting into the creek. However, there was a possibility of some getting at a high tide.

I will be getting back in touch with Mr. Graver and report what we have found. Bob has offered to go out with him if he would like. I have also entered this into CATS (see attached).
