Storm Water Engineering Plan Review Frequently Asked Questions

1. How long does take to get a Storm Water Letter of Approval for Storm Water Engineering Plans?

If all required documents and information are provided, usually a Storm Water Letter of Approval is issued in two weeks from a date of submittal of information.

2. How long a Storm Water Letter of Approval is valid?

If construction has begun within two years after issuance of Storm Water Letter of Approval, the Storm Water Letter of Approval is valid until completion of the project. If construction has not begun within two years after issuance of Storm Water Letter of Approval, the Storm Water Letter of Approval is void, and plans must be resubmitted to the ADEC.

3. What is the fee structure for storm water engineering plan review?

Fee structure is built on "acres of soil disturbed" and can be found in 18 AAC 72.955 <u>Table D. Plan Review Fees (5)</u> (A-D). Check should be payable to "State of Alaska".

4. How does my Storm Water Letter of Approval relate to the APDES Construction General Permit Notice of Intent?

Every construction project that disturbs more than one acre of land must submit an NOI and apply for coverage under the Construction General Permit. Only projects that construct permanent storm water controls have to obtain a Storm Water Letter of Approval. If the installation of permanent storm water control disturbs less than an acre a storm water letter of approval is still required, though a CGP NOI does not need to be filed.

5. What is the permitting process for construction projects in Alaska that have permanent storm water controls?

Construction projects with permanent storm water controls follow a four-step process, they are:

- Obtain a Storm Water Letter of Approval
- Develop a SWPPP
- File an APDES CGP NOI
- Submit a copy of SWPPP (this requirement is different for each MS4 area and for non-MS4 areas)

6. Are there recommended design manuals to use?

There are two manuals that may be helpful in the design process and in filling out the comments on the permanent storm water management control plan review checklist.
