Dear Mr. Leigh:


On October 17, 1996, the Department received your submittal of as-builts for the referenced contaminated soil treatment/disposal project. I have reviewed the submittal and have the following comments:

It appears that the project was completed in substantial conformance with the Department's approved plans. Therefore, all actions required for the Mat-Su Headquarters Building heating oil tank cleanup project (#94-2-2-01-274-01) and the School District Auto Shop underground storage tank cleanup project (#91-2-2-00-218-1) have been completed to the satisfaction of the Department. No further action is needed, and the sites are closed.

Contaminated soil excavated during cleanup of a 1996 above ground tank release from the Willow Public Safety Building, and the contaminated soil from cleanup of a release at the landfill remain stored at the landfill. These soil piles were not included in the road paving project due to the contamination levels being too high for the road project. As discussed in earlier correspondence, Ms. Laura Ogar and Mr. Jeff Ginalias (of the Department) are responsible for overseeing the treatment and disposal of the contaminated soil from the landfill and Willow sites, respectively. They can be reached at 269-7500. I discussed the above with Mr. Dave Carroll, of the Mat-Su Borough in our November 15, 1996 telephone conversation.
