Re: Verification of Institutional Control Compliance at ADOTPF - East Fork Maintenance Station

Dear Mr. Myers:

The Contaminated Sites Program is conducting an audit of contaminated sites closed with conditions (Institutional Controls) to verify that closure stipulations such as periodic monitoring and reporting are being performed by the responsible party of record as required under state law (18 AAC 75.375).

In 2006 the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) granted a No Further Remedial Action Determination for the ADOTPF - East Fork Maintenance Station site that included conditions requiring the groundwater to be monitored during the summer of 2006 for GRO and DRO compounds. According to our records, we have not received groundwater monitoring results for the 2006 sampling event.

Requested Documentation

In order to ensure that conditions at the site are protective of human health, welfare and the environment, DEC requests that you provide the following:

- Nature of the current land use of the ADOTPF - East Fork Maintenance Station property.
- Results of the groundwater monitoring event from summer 2006. If 2006 results are not available, please make arrangements to have the groundwater sampling performed as soon as possible.

In addition to the summer 2006 groundwater monitoring requirement, please be advised that the following Institutional Controls as established in the 2006 No Further Remedial Action Determination continue to apply:

- In accordance with 18 AAC 78.274(b), ADEC approval must be obtained prior to the transport of soil and/or groundwater from this site to an off-site location.
- ADEC shall be notified prior to installation of any drinking or other groundwater extraction wells.

DEC is concerned that the site conditions may not be protective. Failure to maintain these requirements may result in re-opening of the site by the Contaminated Sites Program, in which case, further remediation could be mandatory.
