Dear Mr. Cerny:

The Contaminated Sites Program conducts periodic verification of closed sites where institutional controls (land use restrictions) are required under 18 AAC 75.375. We have identified Bentley Trust Property Tax Lot 221 as a site with institutional controls.

As the current owner of the property you should be aware that there are ongoing obligations for this site.

In order to prevent people from being exposed to any remaining contamination on the property, **this letter is being sent as a <u>reminder</u>** of the conditions placed on the property as part of the 2005 No Further Remedial Action Planned granted by the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation (ADEC). At the time of closure, soil and groundwater contamination were documented as remaining on the property.

During a thorough review of the Bentley Trust Property Tax Lot 221 site record, it was discovered that the Notice of Environmental Cleanup and Residual Soil and Groundwater Contamination (deed notice) signed and notarized in 2006 was never filed with the State of Alaska Recorder's Office. The ADEC filed the notice in the Fairbanks Recording District on June 23, 2015. A copy of the recorded deed notice (Document ID: 2015-009660-0) is enclosed.

Policy and regulations have evolved since this site was closed with conditions in 2005. Please be reminded that the Bentley Trust Property Tax Lot 221 property in Fairbanks is subject to the following site-specific and standard conditions and/or controls:

- 1. Excavation and removal of soil in the vicinity of soil borings SB-2 and SB-11 is restricted without prior ADEC approval. The soil cannot be excavated unless tested first under an ADEC-approved workplan.
- 2. Groundwater is not to be used as a drinking water source. Any use of groundwater within the property boundaries is restricted without prior ADEC approval.
- 3. In the event that the remaining contaminated soil becomes accessible by the building or other structure being removed or through some other action that fits the site circumstances, the landowner and/or operator are required to notify ADEC and evaluate the environmental status of the contamination in accordance with applicable laws and regulations. Further site characterizations and cleanup may be necessary.
- 4. Any proposal to transport soil or groundwater off-site requires ADEC approval in accordance with 18 AAC 75.325(i). A "site" [as defined by 18 AAC 75.990 (115)] means an area that is contaminated, including areas contaminated by the migration of hazardous substances from a source area, regardless of property ownership. This is a standard condition.
- 5. Movement or use of contaminated material in a manner that results in a violation of 18 AAC 70 water quality standards is prohibited. This is a standard condition.

In addition to the conditions above, you are required to notify the ADEC if there are any changes in land use or ownership. Failure to maintain these requirements may result in re-opening the site by the Contaminated Sites Program, in which case, further remediation could be mandatory.

In accordance with 18 AAC 75.380(d)(2), ADEC may require additional site assessment, monitoring, remediation, and/or necessary actions at this facility should new information become available that indicates contamination at this site may pose a threat to human health or the environment.

If you seek to have the institutional controls removed from this site, you can choose at any time to voluntarily conduct additional assessment, monitoring or further cleanup to demonstrate that contamination at the site now meets the applicable cleanup levels under 18 AAC 75.
