ExxonMobil Alaska Production Inc. (EMAP) is providing the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation (ADEC) Contaminated Site (CS) group confirmation that there has been no change in land ownership or use to the Bullen Point Support Pad as required by Stipulation #1 of the Institutional Controls in a Decision Document dated May 10, 2011 (File#: 300.38.190).

- 1. Any future change in land use may impact the exposure assumptions cited in this document. If land use and/or ownership changes, current ICs may not be protective and ADEC may require additional remediation and/or ICs. Therefore ExxonMobil shall report to ADEC once every five years, or as soon as ExxonMobil becomes aware of any change in land ownership or use, if earlier. The report can be sent to the ADEC project manager or electronically to DEC.ICUnit@alaska.gov.*

This site was remediated in 2010 to address a legacy fuel spill. Excavation was limited along the northern edge of the site by the Beaufort Sea. ADEC's 2011 decision document concluded that the site cleanup was complete with Institutional Controls. On May 27, 2015 EMAP provided noticed to ADEC CS that Alaska Clean Sea's (ACS) would be staging a conex inland from the area in which there is remaining contamination. ACS continues to store and access this conex. There have been no other activities/land uses at this site over the past five years.
