ADEC Conditional Approval Amended Engineering Plan  
Capping of Covered Pit

Dear Mr. Jack:

On October 4, 2016, the Kenai Area Office of the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation (ADEC), issued conditional approval of an engineering plan prepared and provided by Tauriainen Engineering & Testing. The subject matter on that plan was Request Approval to Construct Covered Pit Capping.

The engineering plan included engineering details and construction specifications for the construction of an engineering control for the covered pit at the Coastal Drilling "site". The engineering control consists of a watertight membrane placed over the covered pit, overlain with a protective soil cover and asphalt surface. The purpose of this engineering control is to minimize precipitation and surface water infiltration into the covered pit, and to prevent uninformed human exposure to the contents of the covered pit by future landowners and/or operators.


On June 30, 2017, ADEC received amendments to the original engineering plan and a request for ADEC approval of those modifications. The amendments were prepared and provided by Tauriainen Engineering & Testing as a June 30, 2017 memorandum. Clayton Spitzer, P.E., sealed and signed the memorandum. The memorandum modified construction specification #5, and added a new construction specification, #9. The originally approved engineering plan, as amended by the June 30, 2017 memorandum, is hereby conditionally approved, contingent upon compliance with the following conditions:

- 1) ADEC is afforded reasonable opportunity to inspect the construction work.

- 2) Engineering construction record information must be provided to ADEC upon completion of the construction work. This record information must be sealed and signed by a registered professional engineer, and must confirm that the construction work was completed in conformance with the approved engineering plan. This means your engineer must be provided open access for inspections and given sufficient authority and control over the work to ensure the construction work is completed properly. Without this documentation from the professional engineer, ADEC will not be able to respect, or accept, the final constructed work product.
