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Section 1. Permit Administration

1. Permit AQ0267MSS03 remains in effect except as revised in Minor Permit AQ0267MSS04.

Section 2. Minor Permit AQ0267MSS03 Revisions

2. Condition 3.3 of Minor Permit AQ0267MSS03 dated December 14, 2007 is rescinded and replaced with Condition 3 below.
3. By the fifteenth calendar day after the last day of the previous month, add the previous month's total to the preceding 11 months to get the 12 consecutive months total.

Section 3. Terms to Make Permit Enforceable

4. The Permittee must comply with each permit term and condition. Noncompliance with a permit term or condition constitutes a violation of AS 46.14, 18 AAC 50, and, except for those terms or conditions designated in the permit as not federally enforceable, the Clean Air Act, and is grounds for
 - 4.1 an enforcement action; or
 - 4.2 permit termination, revocation and reissuance, or modification in accordance with AS 46.14.280.
5. It is not a defense in an enforcement action to claim that it would have been necessary to halt or reduce the permitted activity in order to maintain compliance with a permit term or condition.
6. Each permit term and condition is independent of the permit as a whole and remains valid regardless of a challenge to any other part of the permit.
7. The permit may be modified, reopened, revoked and reissued, or terminated for cause. A request by the Permittee for modification, revocation and reissuance, or termination or a notification of planned changes or anticipated noncompliance does not stay any permit condition.
8. The permit does not convey any property rights of any sort, nor any exclusive privilege.

Section 4. Permit Documentation

July 10, 2009: Stephen D. Bradley, GKA Operations Manager of ConocoPhillips Alaska Inc. (CPAI) submits minor permit application to revise Condition 3.3 of Minor Permit AQ0267MSS03, a Title 1 Permit Condition.
