Alaskan Establishment Recalls Chicken Caesar Salads

(JUNEAU, AK) – Triple B Corporation, an Anchorage establishment, has issued a recall for Chicken Caesar Salads because the included individual packets of Caesar salad dressing contain egg, a known allergen, that was not included on the label’s list of ingredients.

The recalled 12 oz. plastic containers of “Signature Café GRILLED CHICKEN CAESAR SALAD” may be identified by:

- A use-by date of 8-25-2011 through 8-30-2011 located on a sticker on the top right corner of the package (see photo below).
- A label with the establishment number "P-38458" inside the USDA mark of inspection.


The Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation has confirmed the distribution of the recalled products in Alaska.

There have been no reports of adverse reactions from products recalled by Triple B. However, there has been at least one reported case of an adverse reaction from the consumption of a similar product recalled by Taylor Farms, Triple B’s co-manufacturer of the recalled salads.
