

State of Alaska Import Requirements, 2012
Horses / Burros / Donkeys / Mules

All horses, burros, donkeys, and mules entering Alaska require:

1. Negative EIA within **60 days** preceding importation:
 The State of Alaska accepts the C-Elisa and AGID tests for EIA performed by laboratories that are approved by the USDA (USDA only accepts AGID for international importation of horses)
2. Permit Number:
 This number is issued by our office. To obtain a permit, give us a call. We will need names, physical addresses & telephone numbers for the issuing vet, origin owner, destination owner (if origin & destination owner is the same, we still need both addresses)
3. Health Certificate with permit number & below Statements 1-4
 - Animals **flown or barged** in from another state require state Health Certificate (follow same requirements as above)
 - Animals **travelling through Canada** require an International Health Certificate (IHC).
 The International Health Certificate is obtained through the Federal Veterinarian's office.
 The State of Alaska does accept the IHC; no additional state Health Certificate is required.

Statements required on the health certificate

1. The animals on this health certificate are free from symptoms of any infectious or contagious disease.
2. **Vesicular Stomatitis**, effective date 8/21/06
 The animals on this health certificate have NOT originated from a premises or area under quarantine for Vesicular Stomatitis *or* where Vesicular Stomatitis has been diagnosed in the last 30 days.
3. **Equine Piroplasmiasis**, effective date 9/15/08
 The animals on this health certificate have NOT originated from a premises or area under quarantine for Equine Piroplasmiasis *or* where Equine Piroplasmiasis has been diagnosed in the last 45 days.
4. **CEM**, effective date 2/13/09
 The horse has not been on premises where *T.equigenitalis* has been isolated during the 60 days immediately preceding exportation to Alaska or a premises currently under quarantine or investigation for CEM.
 If female, the horse has not been bred naturally to, or inseminated with semen from, a stallion positive for CEM, or a stallion resident upon a positive premises or under quarantine or investigation for CEM.

HORSES ORIGINATING FROM CANADA
 Horses imported from Canada require:
 Canadian International Health Certificate
 Alaska Permit Number (requested from this office)
 Negative Coggins (EIA) within 60 days
 When horse(s) reaches its destination, the owner is required to call and make an appointment with the Federal Veterinarian to inspect the animal(s) at (907) 688-1229 or (907) 745-3253
