Division of Water

Mission Statement:

Improve and Protect Alaska's Water Quality

How?

Establishes standards for water cleanliness

- Regulates discharges to waters and wetlands
- Provides financial assistance for water and wastewater facility construction and waterbody assessment and remediation
- Trains, certifies, and assists water and wastewater facility system operators
- Monitors and reports on water quality

What are Water Quality Standards (WQS)?

• Are designed to protect public health or welfare

 Help <u>identify</u> polluted waters; <u>clean-up</u> polluted water, and make sure our waters don't get <u>more</u> polluted


What do Water Quality Standards do?

- Standards protect a variety of uses
 - Drinking water
 - Recreation
 - Agriculture/Aquaculture
 - Aquatic life
 - Industrial
 - Other typical activities





Foundation of a Water Quality Standard




-Defined-

 Designated Uses – how water is used (*e.g.* recreational, industrial, aquatic life)

- 2. Criteria are numeric or narrative values.
 Consider how much and how long you may be exposed to a substance or condition
- **3.** Antidegradation process for protecting high quality waters





• Wholly or partially in or bordering the state or under the jurisdiction of the state.

Triennial Review Process

• Occurs every three years as required by the Clean Water Act

• Helps ensure that pollution limits are integrating the latest science, technology, and policy requirements

 Engages interested stakeholders to help increase the effectiveness of this process

Triennial Review Process

- DEC is accepting written comments till the end of 2017
- DEC has posted background materials on the WQS Website

- DEC will accept public testimony following this presentation

2018-2020 High Priority Issues

- Antidegradation Implementation rule making
- Update to 2008 Toxics manual
 - Includes Human Health Criteria (inc. FCR) and other pollutants that could affect aquatic life
- Water Quality Standards Clarifications
- Water Quality Standards Variances

Other issues of interest to DEC

- Numerous other topics are noted in the 2018-2020 Issue Summary
 Available on DEC Website or upon request
- The Triennial Review process will consider all comments pertaining to current or potential issues of interest to the public
- While many topics may not be considered to be a *high priority*, that does not mean that DEC is not interested in pursuing them at some point

- Water Quality Criteria Clarifications
 - Update duration and frequency values- beneficial for monitoring and compliance programs
 - Update Standard Analytical Methods
 - New Definitions (e.g., fresh and marine waters)
- Adoption of Water Quality Standards Variances
 - Consistent with federal CWA rulemaking in 2015
