Thank you for taking a moment to read my concern. My family and I live in Fairbanks, Alaska where the EPA and Alaska DEC are making plans to ban wood burning during the winter, a readily renewable and abundant source to heat homes in Alaska where temperatures typically stay below zero during the winter months.

The EPA and DEC use the excuse of non-attainment for PM2.5 during the winter as the reason to encourage the use of electricity and #1 diesel instead of burning wood. The unique geography of Fairbanks and inversion created by the cold temperatures keeps the exhaust and even steam from rising out of the valleys.
