Subject: Small Area Source of PM2.5 - Charbroiler information request

On January 8, 2020, a new state regulation, 18 AAC 50.078(c), became effective that may affect your business or operations. The Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation (ADEC) regulations were established to address fine particulate matter (PM2.5) air pollution in a portion of the Fairbanks North Star Borough (FNSB) that is designated by the Environmental Protection Agency as a serious PM2.5 non-attainment area (map enclosed). This portion of the FNSB does not meet the federal health based standards for PM2.5, which comes from wood smoke and other combustion sources. PM2.5 may cause health problems when people are exposed to harmful concentrations. High PM2.5 concentrations contribute to increased respiratory symptoms (such as irritation of the airways, coughing, or difficulty breathing), decreased lung function, aggravated asthma, development of chronic bronchitis, irregular heartbeat, nonfatal heart attacks, and premature death in people with heart or lung disease. Controlling particulate matter will benefit public health in the community.

Because charbroilers are a source of particulate matter and other air pollutants, ADEC is federally required to further assess the impacts of these devices and evaluate whether additional control of emissions is technically and economically feasible. The new state regulation requires that all owners or operators of commercial charbroilers within the non-attainment area provide to ADEC a one-time submittal of the information outlined below for each charbroiler device operated using the enclosed form. The information for existing charbroilers is due to ADEC by March 15, 2020 or for future new charbroilers, the information is due within 60 days of commencing operations.

Operators of commercial charbroilers shall submit the following information:

- 1. Name and location of the commercial cooking operation
- 2. Operation type chain driven or underfired
- 3. Number and size, in cooking surface square feet, of each charbroiler at the operation
- 4. Type of fuel used to heat each charbroiler
- 5. Type and quantity, in pounds, of meat cooked on the each charbroiler on a weekly basis for the previous 12-month period
- 6. Daily operating hours of the commercial cooking operation
- 7. Air flow rate, measured in cubic feet per minute, of hood or exhaust system serving each charbroiler

8. Manufacturer and model of any installed pollution control devices designed to reduce particulates, kitchen smoke, or odor


