Subject: Small Area Source of PM2.5 – Used Oil Burner information request

On January 8, 2020, a new state regulation, 18 AAC 50.078(c), became effective that may affect your business or operations. The Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation's (ADEC) regulations were established to address fine particulate matter (PM2.5) air pollution in a portion of the Fairbanks North Star Borough that is designated by the Environmental Protection Agency as a serious PM2.5 non-attainment area (map enclosed). This portion of the FNSB does not meet the federal health based standards for PM2.5, which comes from wood smoke and other combustion sources. PM2.5 may cause health problems when people are exposed to harmful concentrations. High PM2.5 concentrations contribute to increased respiratory symptoms (such as irritation of the airways, coughing, or difficulty breathing), decreased lung function, aggravated asthma, development of chronic bronchitis, irregular heartbeat, nonfatal heart attacks, and premature death in people with heart or lung disease. Controlling particulate matter will benefit public health in the community.

Because used oil burners are a source of particulate matter and other air pollutants, ADEC is federally required to further assess the impacts of these devices and evaluate whether additional control of emissions is technically and economically feasible. The new state regulation only requires that all owners or operators of commercial used oil burner within the non-attainment area **provide** to **ADEC** a one-time submittal of the information outlined below for each device operated using the enclosed form. The information for existing used oil burners is due to **ADEC** by March 15, 2020 or for future new used oil burners, the information is due within 60 days of commencing operations.

Operators of commercial used oil burners shall submit the following:

- 1. name and location of the device operation
- 2. the purpose of the burner, for example, space heating or boiler operation
- 3. number and type of burners
- 4. type of fuel used, for example lubricants, heat transfer fluids, solvents, cleaning agents, mixtures, or cooking oil
- 5. fuel source, for example, if it is purchased, self-generated, or disposal
- 6. fuel quality, including whether it is raw or processed and, if processed whether it is processed to specifications
- 7. amount of fuel, measured in gallons, consumed by each burner in an hour
- 8. daily operating hours for each burner

- 9. applicable emission limits and regulatory authorities that govern their operation
- 10. manufacturer and model of each burner
- 11. manufacturer and model of any installed pollution control devices designed to control or limit particulates, smoke, or odor

If your operation does not include use of the device listed in this letter please respond with an affirmation declaring that no such device is used. There are no other new requirements for you or your business beyond the submittal of this information to ADEC.


