## Dear Interested Person:

The Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) proposes to change regulations in Title 18, Chapter 36 of the Alaska Administrative Code, Animal Health. The amendment proposes requiring a unique trackable and traceable number on health certificates and certificates of veterinary inspections, adding goat and sheep *Mycoplasma ovipneumoniae* testing requirements prior to animal importation, updates to disease reporting requirements, updating from the 2013 to the 2020 version of the adopted by reference the American Veterinary Medical Association's (AVMA) Guidelines for Euthanasia of Animals, and conforming and clarifying edits.

The comments must be received no later than 11:59 pm on September 30, 2020.

We will respond to questions that are relevant to the proposed changes if the questions are received in writing at least ten days before the end of the public comment period. If questions are submitted after that, we may, but we are not required to respond to those questions. The questions and answers will be available on the Department of Environmental Conservation's website at <a href="https://dec.alaska.gov/eh/vet/regulations/animal-health/">https://dec.alaska.gov/eh/vet/regulations/animal-health/</a>. One consolidated answer may be provided for a group of questions that are similar, as appropriate.

We do not respond individually to comments on proposed regulations changes. After we have a chance to review the written comments received and then consider them in deciding what changes (if any) to make in our regulations, we will prepare a summary of the comments and our responses to them, which will be sent to everyone who submits a timely written comment on the proposed changes and provides a return mailing

or email address. Individual commenters will not be identified in the summary; however, the comments themselves are public records subject to public inspection.
