Your testimony may include questions for the department regarding the proposed regulations. All questions received before October 19th, 2020, at 11:59 p.m., either in writing or in this public hearing, will be answered. Answers will be posted on our website before the close of the public comment period.

At this point I would like to state who is in attendance from DEC staff. We have me, Rebecca Smith; Commissioner Jason Brune; Cindy Heil; Alice Edwards; and Adeyemi Alimi.

At this point, we have one person from the public who has indicated that she wants to provide testimony, and one person in listen-only mode. If the person in listen-only mode changes their mind and wishes to provide testimony, you will need to hang up the phone and call back in to

the system, and they will put you back into the system in the proper order.

We value your participation in the public comment process. Your input at this hearing is one of the principal ways to contribute to our decision-making process. Your comments may influence the final regulations and will help us to better serve you and other Alaskans.

People signed in, if you have registered to just listen in, as I stated, and you later decide you want to provide comment, just please hang up and call back into the system.

Testimony will be taken in the order in which you have registered into the Digital Witness system. Anyone who is online and has signed in before 7:30, when the hearing is scheduled to close, will be given the opportunity to testify in case we run over.

All testimony will be accepted during the public hearing, but it won't be addressed until after the close of our public comment period, which closes on October 29, 2020, at 11:59 p.m.

B-A-R-B-A-R-A H-A-N-E-Y. I live at 520 North Freeman Road, North Pole, Alaska, and thank God I live outside the attainment area, the problem area, but I live close enough to the containment area that a lot of this will affect me in one way or the other.

I'm calling as my own self, but I happen to work with the public a lot and have done what I can to try to give some light or attention to what's going on. You guys have done phenomenal work. It was a lot of hard work. You've got some great stuff.

The problem I'm having is, first off -- now, I did see how quick and easy it is to adopt regulation by referring to certain documents. I get it. I understand it's easier to do it that way, particularly with issues that are as complicated as this, but the vast majority of the people do not understand what you're doing. They really don't. They don't understand, and my major fear of what's going to happen is in six months to a year from now, something is going to pop up out of this thing and is going to bite us in the back side, and we're going to be blindsided.

And what I really wish the

department would do -- and you don't have to do anything, but I think if you really want to get some public feedback, is you might want to put together a presentation that kind of goes down into the details of what these regulations mean, because for the average person right now, they have no idea what all this means. I think a lot of people are not aware that some of the wood stoves that they're using right now are not meeting the EPA standard. I think a lot of people are scrambling, trying to figure out where their catalyst is and where it's at on their wood stove and "How do I make sure it's clean, and what the heck is it?"

And there's a lot of people who are just basically confused. They think, "Well, I spent all this money on a wood stove at Woodway or whatever way, and, gosh, we thought it was -- you know, it has these EPA regulations, and it's going to turn out now I have to replace it? What?"

You know, I think there are a lot of things that people may not be thinking through the ramifications of what this all means. I mean, there's some things in these regulations that have to do with the buying and selling of their home and what kind of wood stove is in there. And I think a

lot of real estate agents probably aren't even aware of that, and that's going to have an impact on the real estate market.

So, I guess, you guys have done a lot of work. You've done yeoman's work on this, and I applaud you for it, but I think that a lot of people don't understand all the details of what these regulations mean. I mean, not everybody has the opportunity to sit down and spend two or three days just reading through all this stuff. And even if they did, they're not going to -- a lot of them are not going to have a grasp of what this means for them.

And so I would encourage you folks to think about doing some kind of PowerPoint presentation or some kind of video or some kind of something to bring this down to the level of the average person who is living this. Okay?

Because while I'm not in the containment area, you know, things could change, and, boy, would my life change if I was in the containment area. And I can just see, you know, just as I drive home, various people that I know, and they don't even know this is going on. You know, I try to tell them. They say, "Well, they're
