

AIR QUALITY CONTROL: NOTICE OF CANCELLATION OF PUBLIC HEARING  
OF PROPOSED CHANGES ON AIR QUALITY CONTROL  
IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE ALASKA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL  
CONSERVATION

BRIEF DESCRIPTION

The Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation proposes to add new regulations regarding electronic submission requirements and consistency of reporting methodologies for air permits.

The Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation (ADEC) proposes to adopt a regulation change in Title 18, Chapter 50 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with new regulations for electronic submission requirements and consistency of emissions reporting methodologies for air permits, and updating an adoption by reference to federal requirements, including the following:

- (1) 18 AAC 50.030 is proposed to be amended by updating the *State Air Quality Control Plan* to amend Volume III Appendix to Volume II Section II to incorporate the proposed regulations after public review and comment. The intended effect of the amendments is to maintain consistency between the regulations and the *State Air Quality Control Plan*.
- (2) 18 AAC 50.040(g) is proposed to be amended by adding a new paragraph that would adopt by reference federal regulations for municipal solid waste landfills.
- (3) 18 AAC 50.270 is proposed to be added as a new section that would establish requirements for electronic submission of documents under air permits and authorizations, establish the procedures the department will follow to develop additional forms for electronic reporting requirements, and provide a definition of the Permittee Portal which will be used for electronic submissions.
- (4) 18 AAC 50.275 is proposed to be added as a new section that would require sources to use consistent pollutant-specific emissions factors and calculation methods for all reporting requirements under 18 AAC 50.

If adopted, ADEC will submit the applicable regulation revisions to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for inclusion in the approved State Implementation Plan (SIP).

### **Hearings**

ADEC published a public notice regarding these proposed changes on October 22, 2021. In the public notice the Department announced that a public hearing for these proposed regulations was tentatively scheduled for Tuesday, November 30, 2021, from 12:00 p.m. to 2:00 p.m. via teleconference. **The Department did not receive a request to hold the public hearing by 5:00 p.m. on Friday, November 19, 2021, as required in the original public notice. Therefore, the public hearing will not be held.**

The questions must be received at least 10 days before the end of the public comment period, Friday, December 3, 2021. The Department may, but is not required to, answer written questions received after Friday, December 3, 2021, the cut-off date.

The language of the final regulation may be different from that of the proposed regulation. **YOU SHOULD COMMENT DURING THE TIME ALLOWED IF YOUR INTERESTS COULD BE AFFECTED.** Written comments received are public records and are subject to public inspection.
