Dear Mr. Sixkiller:

This letter provides amendments to Alaska's *State Air Quality Control Plan* or State Implementation Plan (SIP) for air quality permit administration and compliance fees, air quality emission fees, and associated regulations and for electronic submission requirements and consistency of reporting methodologies. The revisions were two separate packages, but both packages were signed and filed on the same day and will become effective on the same date, so DEC is submitting them together under one letter. However, they will be submitted as two separate entries in SPeCS to make document tracking easier. Both revised regulations packages have an effective date of September 7, 2022. Specific provisions are submitted for EPA approval, while other provisions are included for informational purposes only, to show a complete record of the rulemaking.

On August 8, 2022, the Lt. Governor signed and filed the following changes to the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation's (DEC) regulations in 18 AAC 50:

Fee Package:

- Amend 18 AAC 50.030(a) to adopt revisions to the State Air Quality Control Plan by amending Volume III Appendix to Volume II, Section II.A to incorporate the proposed regulations after public review and comment. This appendix within the State Air Quality Control Plan contains the state's air quality regulations.
- Repeal and readoption of 18 AAC 50.400 to revise permit administration and compliance fees in accordance with the fee study report, clarify language for consistency, and add definitions.
- Amend 18 AAC 50.410(a) to revise emission fee exemptions.
- Amend 18 AAC 50.410(b) and (g) to revise emission fees in accordance with the fee study report.
- Amend 18 AAC 50.420(a) to revise language addressing billing procedures and timing of supplemental billing.

Electronic Submission and Consistency in Reporting Methodologies Package:

- Amend 18 AAC 50.030(a) to adopt revisions to the State Air Quality Control Plan by amending Volume III Appendix to Volume II, Section II.A to incorporate the proposed regulations after public review and comment. This appendix within the State Air Quality Control Plan contains the state's air quality regulations.
- Amend 18 AAC 50.040(g) to add a new paragraph adopting by reference federal regulations for municipal solid waste landfills.
- Add new section 18 AAC 50.270 that would establish requirements for electronic submission of documents required under air permits and authorizations, establish the procedures the department will follow to develop additional forms for electronic reporting requirements, and provide a definition of the permittee portal which will be used for electronic submissions.
- Add new section 18 AAC 50.275 that would require sources to use consistent pollutant-specific emissions factors and calculation methods for all reporting requirements under 18 AAC 50.

DEC is submitting the relevant parts of the Fees amendments and Electronic Submission and Consistency in Reporting Methodologies amendments to EPA for approval today. Changes and additions to the following revised and new sections of the 18 AAC 50 are being submitted for approval:

- 18 AAC 50.400(d) (h)
- 18 AAC 50.270
- 18 AAC 50.275

We will submit the documents listed in the enclosures via the EPA's SPeCS system. If requested, we can provide one paper copy and one electronic version of the documents to Kristin Hall of your staff (note that the electronic version would be an exact duplicate of the paper copy).
