## CIAP WEAR Trip Report South Naknek (population 75) June 17<sup>th</sup>, 2014



Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation (ADEC) Solid Waste Program (Kym Bronson and Stephen Price) conducted a Coastal Impact Assistance Program (CIAP), Waste Erosion Assessment and Review (WEAR) site visit for South Naknek on June 17<sup>th</sup>, 2014. Jeff Elbie, Bristol Bay Borough, participated in the site visit. The following narrative is a brief description of our findings during the June inspection.

## **WEAR Sites**

Landfill, 58.70391/-157.03439 (Active) — The South Naknek Landfill is located approximately 2,500 feet from the Naknek River and approximately 5,500 feet from the community. This permitted landfill is operated by the Bristol Bay Borough and has an operator onsite to maintain it. There is a Summit burn unit for burnable waste. Ash and other municipal waste is compacted and covered behind the burn unit. The landfill also accepts construction and demolition debris. The landfill has adequate separation. Vehicles are drained of fluids; and lead acid batteries and electronics are stored for eventual backhaul. Used oil is burned for energy recovery. Hazardous waste is not accepted at this facility. There was no erosion reported within the immediate vicinity.







➤ Old Trident Seafoods Plant, 58.711953/-157.054083 (Abandoned) – This old Trident Seafood Plant has been unused for many years and is deteriorating and eroding into the river. It is not listed on the Contaminated Sites Database and from a visual inspection consists of inert waste (wood, brick, and scrap metal) and various machinery. One large building of the plant is located below the tideline while the other structures are on higher ground. The higher structures are located approximately 100 feet from the Naknek River tideline.











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
