Methanol Health Effects

Low level (< 200 ppm): Increase of formic acid in blood.

Medium level (200 - 1000 ppm): Nose and throat irritation, unpleasant odor, nausea, and headache

High level (>1000 ppm): headache, nausea, dizziness, weakness, vertigo, chills, shooting pains in extremities, unsteady, dermatitis, numbness, edema, nervousness, visual effects. Long term or large exposures can lead to failure of vision.

NOTE: Methanol occurs naturally in humans, plants and animals.

Cancer ranking: EPA has not classified methanol as a human carcinogen.
