



## **ANTHC Water Treatment for Utility Managers – June 9-11, 2026**

This class will meet Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, June 9 -11, 2026, from approximately 10:00 am to 12:30 pm.

The purpose of the class is for utility managers and local government officials to learn how water treatment works so they can better understand their role in the utility and improve communication with the water plant operators they work with.

### **Day 1 – 2 hours**

The introductory class addresses the question of what we need to remove during water treatment and why. The presentation discusses physical, biological and chemical contaminants common in surface and groundwater sources and the regulations concerning drinking water in Alaska.

### **Day 2 – 2.5 hours**

The second session addresses the function, purpose and required maintenance of common treatment techniques and equipment in rural Alaska. It also addresses basic operational safety concerns.

### **Day 3 – 2.5 hours**

The third session begins with a discussion of a Utility Manager’s role in water treatment operations. It briefly covers organizational, personnel and financial management followed by a discussion of operations management. The session concludes with a discussion of water/sewer funding, constructive communication and technical assistance providers.

To take part in the course, students will need:

- Time allotted in their work schedule to attend the training.
- Use of a computer and access to internet.
- An active email address to receive documents for the course and links to Zoom classroom.
- Consistent internet access and the ability to watch/listen over Zoom.
