Project #503181-SE, Lift Station 5 and Force Main Replacement

ADEC awards \$7.4 million low-interest loan to the City of Kodiak to design and replace the City's largest lift station.

The Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation (ADEC) amended an existing loan to add \$2,000,000 in additional funding, including \$500,000 in loan forgiveness. With this amendment, the total loan amount available to the City of Kodiak for this project totals \$7,400,000.

This project will design and replace the City's largest lift station that is 50 years old and has reached the end of its useful life. Work will include the design and construction of a new wet well; replacement of all pumps, electrical controls and equipment; construction of a new lift station building to house the pump equipment and controls; replacement of influent piping and manholes; installation of a new generator; and replacement of approximately 1,500 feet of 16-inch force main.



ADEC is authorized by state law to issue loans to borrowers for eligible wastewater system infrastructure projects. Administration of the loan is through the ADEC State Revolving Fund Program under the authority of the Alaska Clean Water Fund.

The loan carries a below-market finance rate of 1.65625%, payable over 20 years. The Alaska Clean Fund is capitalized annually by a grant from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. Clean Water State Revolving Fund programs operate nationwide to provide states and communities with the resources necessary to maintain and improve the infrastructure that protects our valuable water resources.
