**TMDL and Alternative to a TMDL Recovery Plan  
 Prioritization and Schedule**  
 Draft 2024 Integrated Report

DEC has reviewed currently impaired waterbody assessment units (Category 5) and proposes the following prioritization and schedule<sup>1</sup> for development of waterbody restoration plans<sup>2</sup> including Total Maximum Daily Loads (TMDL). The approach used for each Category 5 waterbody will be based on criteria and considerations described in [Alaska’s Prioritization Framework 2022-2032 Clean Water Act Vision for Section 303\(d\)](#) including the severity of the pollution and affects to designated uses.

Entries with “CS” identify waterbodies that are contaminated sites, and the target completion date is typically dependent on the responsible lead agency or organization completing required site recovery documents.
