<u>TIME/DATE OF SPILL</u>: 4:15 A.M. January 16, 2007. The spill was reported to ADEC by the U.S. Coast Guard Marine Safety Detachment, Unalaska at 7:30 A.M. January 16, 2007.

TIME/DATE OF SITUATION REPORT: 11:00 A.M. on January 17, 2007

TIME/DATE OF THE NEXT REPORT: This is the final report.

TYPE/AMOUNT OF PRODUCT SPILLED: The crew of the vessel estimated the volume of the spill to be less than 100 gallons of diesel and engine oils. The vessel operator reported that some diesel fuel was lost out of the day-tank vent when the vessel keeled over and there was additional engine oil and hydraulic oil discharged during the dewatering of the engine room spaces.

LOCATION: East Side of Hog Island, Unalaska

<u>CAUSE OF SPILL</u>: Vessel grounding; the cause of the grounding will be under investigation by the U.S. Coast Guard.

POTENTIAL RESPONSIBLE PARTY (PRP): Arctic Hunter LLC

RESPONSE ACTION: At 11:30 A.M. on January 16, 2007 the Arctic Hunter was moored and boomed at the Magone Marine Services facility at 991 Ballyhoo Road in Dutch Harbor. Workers used three dewatering pumps to keep the vessel dewatered as dive teams surveyed the hull damage and made temporary repairs to the vessel's hull. The dive survey found no fuel leaking from the vessel's fuel tanks.

Coast Guard staff from the Marine Safety Detachment was able to complete a daylight on-water survey of the spill area and found no lingering fuel or oil contamination. There were also no reports from local aircraft traffic on sheens on the water in the vicinity of the grounding and Hog Island area.

SOURCE CONTROL: The vessel has been re-floated.

RESOURCES AFFECTED: Waters of Unalaska Bay and shoreline of Hog Island. No oiled wildlife has been observed.

<u>FUTURE PLANS AND RECOMMENDATIONS</u>: ADEC will continue to monitor response actions with the Coast Guard.

WEATHER: Overcast, south winds 30 knots, seas 3 feet, rain showers.
