



Military Munitions Response Program Fact Sheet King Salmon, Alaska

April 2006

Introduction

The United States Air Force is evaluating two sites near King Salmon under the Military Munitions Response Program (MMRP). We are looking for any information the public may have regarding the history of these sites in an effort to learn more about possible past uses. We are particularly interested in information about munitions at these site or any other areas at King Salmon. A field investigation is scheduled for May 16th through May 19th. In order for us to use information provided by the public during this investigation, we would like to receive all information by **April 25, 2006**.

What is MMRP?

The MMRP is a comprehensive program that addresses the potential hazards present at former munitions response sites that were used before September 30th, 2002. Munitions response sites are areas the Department of Defense (DoD) used for munitions-related activities and are now closed or inactive. These sites contain or are suspected to contain unexploded ordnance (UXO), discarded military munitions (DMM), or munitions constituents (MC). The program focuses on how munitions remaining on a site could affect people or the environment.

The MMRP Goals

The overall goals of the MMRP are to 1) identify where, what kind, and to what extent munitions are present; 2) determine the hazards to human health and the environment; 3) establish goals and metrics to track progress; 4) prioritize which sites require response actions before others; 5) conduct necessary response actions; and 6) transfer land consistent with the munitions response completed.

Comprehensive Site Evaluation

The first step in the MMRP is the Comprehensive Site Evaluation, which is conducted in two phases. Phase 1 consists of historical record reviews, visual surveys, limited geophysical surveys, and personal interviews. Phase 2 involves a thorough site investigation with soil

and water sampling. We are currently initiating Phase 1 of the Comprehensive Site Evaluation in order to prioritize sites in Alaska for future work.

Where is the Site?

King Salmon is one of many military installations in Alaska included in the MMRP. There are two suspected munitions sites near King Salmon:

- King Salmon Open Burn/Open Detonation (OB/OD) UXO. This site is estimated to be 15 acres in size and is located in the southeast portion of the air station.
- King Sand Pit UXO. This site is approximately 5 acres in size and is also located in the southeastern portion of the air station.
