<u>TIME/DATE OF SPILL</u>: According to Arctic Slope Regional Corporation, the truck rollover occurred at 8:00 AM on November 20, 2004. The spill was discovered at sunrise, at approximately 9:30 AM. Alyeska Pipeline Service Company (APSC) was notified by ASRC of the spill at 11:30 AM. APSC reported the spill to the Trooper Dispatch at 2:40 PM who notified ADEC at 2:45 PM.

TIME/DATE OF SITUATION REPORT: 11:00 AM, on November 22, 2004

<u>TIME/DATE OF THE NEXT REPORT:</u> This is the final report.

<u>TYPE/AMOUNT OF PRODUCT SPILLED</u>: The spill was a mixture of vehicle fluids. APSC estimated that 175 gallons of diesel was released from the truck's saddle tanks, 30 gallons of hydraulic oil, 15 gallons of motor oil, and 7 gallons of propylene glycol.

LOCATION: Dalton Highway Mile Post 317.8 which is about 100 miles south of Deadhorse near Pump Station 3.

CAUSE OF SPILL: Truck rollover. Detailed information is still under investigation.

POTENTIAL RESPONSIBLE PARTY (PRP): Arctic Slope Regional Corporation (ASRC).

<u>RESPONSE ACTION</u>: The driver of the end dump truck was injured in the rollover and was medivaced from the site to Fairbanks Memorial Hospital. The truck was hauling large rock at the time of the accident.

Initial response consisted of removing the grossly contaminated snow and soil by hand. Contaminated willow vegetation was also cut and removed. The end dump truck was removed from the site by ASRC on November 21, 2004. All remaining fluids from the truck were lightered once the truck had been turned upright on the road.

A cleanup / waste disposal plan has been approved and signed by ADEC.

SOURCE CONTROL: None, most of the fluids had leaked from the truck.

<u>RESOURCES AFFECTED:</u> Snow, tundra, gravel, and the frozen bed of Polygon Creek. There is no running water in Polygon Creek at this time.

<u>FUTURE PLANS AND RECOMMENDATIONS</u>: Improve access from the highway to the spill site with rig mats. A backhoe will be required to recover the contaminated snow and soil. Confirmation of cleanup will be obtained by sampling the spill site.

WEATHER: Current weather conditions in Deadhorse: Clear, 3 degrees Fahrenheit, winds out of the east at 15 mph.
