SITUATION REPORT

INCIDENT NAME: *Empress of the North* Grounding **SITREP** #: 3

<u>TIME/DATE OF SPILL</u>: At approximately 12:35 AM on May 14, 2007, the vessel sent a radio report to the U.S. Coast Guard reporting the incident.

TIME/DATE OF SITUATION REPORT: 12:00 PM, May 15, 2007.

TIME/DATE OF THE NEXT REPORT: As the situation warrants.

<u>TYPE/AMOUNT OF PRODUCT SPILLED</u>: A light sheen was observed in the immediate area of the grounding that may be due to the vessel. The vessel's crew reported approximately 25,000 gallons of diesel fuel oil on board the vessel at the time of the grounding. One empty fuel tank was breached during the grounding.

LOCATION: The vessel grounded on Hanus Reef, a charted and marked reef, near the intersection of Icy Strait and Chatham Strait (Southeast Alaska) about 25 air miles southwest of Juneau.

<u>CAUSE OF SPILL</u>: The vessel struck Hanus Reef resulting in significant damage to the vessel's hull. The cause of the vessel grounding is under investigation by the National Transportation Safety Board (NTSB) and U.S. Coast Guard.

POTENTIAL RESPONSIBLE PARTY (PRP): Majestic America Cruise Line or American West Steamboat Co.

RESPONSE ACTION: The *Empress of the North* arrived at the Alaska Marine Highway Dock in Auke Bay at approximately 10:00 AM on May 14, 2007. The vessel remains at the Alaska Marine Highway System dock. Responders completed booming of the vessel on the evening of May 14.

A salvage team conducted an initial inspection of the vessel's hull for damage on May 14th. Preliminary results of the survey, provided by the U.S. Coast Guard Sector Juneau, indicate that the first four voids on the starboard side are flooded. In this context, a void is the space created by structural members of a vessel's double-hulled bottom. The forepeak is reported to have a 1 ½ foot by 8 foot breach. Number 1 starboard void was reported to have a 4 foot by 3-inch hole. Divers were unable to video tape the damage found yesterday due to poor visibility in the water. Divers will attempt to video the damaged hull today.

The Unified Command stood down yesterday afternoon (May 14). The damage assessment and salvage is being managed by the cruise ship company and salvors with oversight by the U.S. Coast Guard and ADEC. The NTSB team has arrived in Juneau and initiated the investigation into the grounding. Majestic America Cruise Lines corporate representatives are on scene in Juneau and providing assistance.

SOURCE CONTROL: The Southeast Alaska Petroleum Resource Organization (SEAPRO) boomed the vessel and continues to standby at Auke Bay with the Oil Spill Response Vessel (OSRV) *Neka Bay*, one 249-barrel oil response barge, and additional spill response equipment. No sheen has been observed coming from the vessel.

RESOURCES AFFECTED: Marine Waters near Hanus Reef. There have been no reports of impact to wildlife.

FUTURE PLANS AND RECOMMENDATIONS: The NTSB investigation will continue its investigation. Divers will attempt to conduct a video survey of the damage to the vessels hull.
