SITUATION REPORT

INCIDENT NAME: Weaver Brother Truck Rollover Dalton Mi 290 **SITREP #:** 1 and Final

SPILL NUMBER: 08399922002 **LEDGER CODE:** Not Requested

TIME/DATE OF SPILL: The incident occurred at 7:45 AM on August 7, 2008. Weaver Brothers Inc. (Weaver Brothers) reported the incident to ADEC at 8:15 AM on August 8, 2008.

TIME/DATE OF SITUATION REPORT: 3:00 PM on August 8, 2008

TIME/DATE OF THE NEXT REPORT: This is the final report

TYPE/AMOUNT OF PRODUCT SPILLED: The PRP estimated 500 gallons of mineral oil was spilled on the roadway embankment and ditch soil.

LOCATION: Mile 290 Dalton Highway

CAUSE OF SPILL: A northbound 10,500-gallon mobile tanker hauling 8,400 gallons of mineral oil for a North Slope contractor swerved to avoid a moose, which caused the driver to lose control and depart the highway. This resulted in the tanker landing on its side with a breached cargo tank.

POTENTIAL RESPONSIBLE PARTY (PRP): Weaver Brothers Inc.

RESPONSE ACTION: Weaver Brothers initially responded to the incident by constructing earthen dams using existing soil to contain the spilled oil. Weaver Brothers immediately dispatched a recovery vehicle, hazardous material response contractor, and another tanker for product transfer to the scene. The remaining oil in the breached cargo tank was pumped into the response tanker prior to recovering the wrecked truck from the ditch. Approximately 1,200 gallons of spilled product and water was recovered from the ditch.

SOURCE CONTROL: The breached cargo tank was lightered and the vehicle was recovered.

RESOURCES AFFECTED: Weaver Brothers reported that approximately 600 square feet area of tundra vegetation and 500 feet of ditch soil was affected by the spill. No impacts to wildlife or other resources have been reported.

FUTURE PLANS AND RECOMMENDATIONS: Three spill responders will remain on at the incident location and continue with tundra and soil cleanup.

WEATHER: Cloudy, <10 mph winds, 40° F.
