<p>The F/V Mar-Gun will be towed from Zapadni Harbor, St George Island, Alaska to Dutch Harbor, Alaska.</p> <p>If there are no unexpected structural, mechanical, or stability issues and the weather allows for safe passage to Dutch Harbor, the transit will take between 1 1/2 to 2 days, depending on conditions offshore.</p> <p>The F/V Mar-Gun will transit directly from St. George Island to Unalaska Island and enter Dutch Harbor. The transit time by direct route of 200 nautical miles at 6 nm/hr is approximately 33 hours. Transit time may vary with offshore conditions and other variables.</p> <p>The vessel will be towed astern by the M/V Redeemer to the Magone Marine Dock in Dutch Harbor, which is approximately 200 miles from St George Island.</p> <p>The Coast Guard estimates that approximately 800 gallons of miscellaneous petroleum remain onboard F/V Mar-Gun. This includes 300 gallons of diesel in the day tank which will be used to operate the onboard generators that will power equipment and navigation lights during the transit to Dutch Harbor.</p> <p>Prior to moving the vessel into port, the salvor will perform an assessment of the vessel's condition and receive approval from the Port of Dutch Harbor. In port the vessel will be tied up at the Magone dock. The vessel will be moored so as to avoid impeding local commerce. The salvor will deploy containment boom around the vessel to control any discharge that may occur.</p> <p>There are no emergency places of refuge along the transit from St George Island to Dutch Harbor.</p> <p>Crew: The minimum compliment of two crew members will be onboard during the transit to Dutch Harbor. Their work schedule will be carefully structured to minimize fatigue.</p> <p>Stability: Scuppers & freeing ports will be clear and gear and hatches secured.</p> <p>EPIRB & Communications: - 406 MHz EPIRB, properly mounted and in the ARMED position. - Communications equipment operable and adequate for voyage. - Emergency power for communications equipment and/or back up handheld VHF radio on board.</p> <p>Immersion Suits: Suits inspected for good condition and readily accessible with lights attached.</p> <p>Survival Craft: SOLAS life raft with capacity for crew will be readily available for deployment.</p> <p>Dry Suits Worn on Deck: - Crewmembers are to wear dry suits when on deck in hazardous conditions. - Personal marker lights [strobe, fixed bright, etc] are to be attached to their flotation devices.</p> <p>Damage Control: Dewatering pumps are to be regularly monitored. Vessel holds and void spaces are to be checked regularly for unanticipated ingress of water.</p> <p>- Fire Fighting: Adequate number of serviced fire extinguishers are onboard.</p> <p>SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS: F/V Mar-Gun crew will keep onboard all PPE required by federal, state, and local regulations and Tow Plan at all times. Vessel will keep a four (4) hour communications schedule with CG Sector Anchorage at (907) 271-6777. Make regular checks of void spaces and holds to ensure there is no unexpected flooding or unexpected ingress of water. Make Immediate notification in the event of ingress of water that exceeds pump capability, any damage that affects the seaworthiness of the vessel, any pollution, or any other event that otherwise is deemed unsafe or affects the safe navigation of the vessel. Notify CG Sector Anchorage upon arrival at Dutch Harbor.</p>
